


ASK DR. MUERTA FOR CRAFTY HELP & ADVICE!

Dear Dr. Muerta – I've been creating art since I was little, painting and drawing, and I have enjoyed making quilts and crocheting. Lately, though, I've had zero creative inspiration and I haven't picked up a brush or pencil or piece of fabric or yard in months. Do you have any suggestions on how I can get inspired to start getting back into my creative life?

Dear Angsty Artist – As a painter and crafter myself, there is nothing more frustrating than stalling artistically! Arg! Any artist will have at least a moment of that feeling, peering into the creative bucket and finding nothing. There are lots of ways to knock stuff lose, though. One way that I really enjoy is trying out some totally new medium. If you paint with oil, try ink and watercolor. If you're into drawing black and white, trying using color pencils!

Another great way to get inspired is to get out and see the art, music or film of another artist. See a band, go to an art museum, an arboretum or formal garden, go somewhere that you've never gone before. Here in San Diego we have all music, art, photography and history all in one place at Balboa Park. That's a great way to spend a day. CRAFTY HOW-TO:

RECYCLED CAN LUMINARIAS

Supplies Needed:

- Canned food cans
- Nails in different sizes
- Hammer
- Sharpie Pen
- Paper
- Scissors
- Safety goggles
- Floral wire, heavy gauge for hanging

Start your project by eating some of the food in your pantry that is in cans. Fun right? Well this is the perfect punching about opportunity to take those cans that you would throw away, into romantic whimsical can luminaries! They will brighten up your little gatherings and barbeques.

Collect the cans in different sizes. Clean them out and holes make sure that the top where the lid was cut off isn't more light. sharp. If you have a nail file, or sand paper, that will do the trick. Fill them up with water and freeze them. The ice will allow you to punch holes in the can sides and not dent the can shape.

Cut out pieces of paper in the same size as the original label for the cans. Draw designs of stars or swirls with a sharpie pen. Once the water is completely frozen, bring out and place on side. Tape the paper to the can.

Place the can on a cutting board on a towel. Put your safety goggles on. Protect those eyes.

Use the hammer and nail to punch a hole a long the pat-

tern. Space hole vour 1/2" less/more depending the design. Remember more means

Hawaiian Chicken Sandwich

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 3/4 cup San-J International Wheat Free-Gluten Free Teriyaki Sauce
- 4 thin slices of gluten free deli
- 1 small can Dole pineapple rings (contains 4 rings)
- 4 thin Slices Swiss cheese
- I large onion, cut into rings, sautéed until tender but still crisp (or on grill)
- 1 bottle Jonathan's Q Gourmet Honey BBQ Sauce for dipping
- 8 slices gluten free multigrain bread (I prefer Udi's multigrain)

Key Lime Pie Crust

- 1 pkg Mi-Del gluten free Pecan Cookies
- 4 Tbsp butter, melted
- 2 Tbsp sugar (can omit if you prefer not as sweet)

Filling

- 1 14 oz can sweetened condensed milk
- 2 egg yolks
- 1 whole egg
- 1/2 cup key lime juice or the juice of limes to equal

Hawaiian Chicken Sandwich - Directions

Pound each chicken breast to 1/2 " thickness and put all 4 into a resealable bag. Pour the teriyaki sauce into the bag, squeeze out air, and seal. Move the chicken around in bag to ensure they are all coated with sauce. Return to refrigerator and allow to marinate for at least 4 hours.

Using non-stick spray or olive oil, lightly oil the grates of grill and preheat on med-high. Reduce to medium and

grill the breasts 4-6 minutes on each side until lightly browned. They are thin so they'll cook fast. With the second turn of the chicken, grill the four pineapple rings and the 4 slices of ham just until grate marks show and they are warmed.

Assemble:

While still on the grill and fully cooked, turn off grill and first lay 1 slice of ham on top of the chicken breast, then 1 pineapple ring, and finally 1 slice of cheese. Close the lid and allow cheese to melt. Remove from grill and cover with foil.

Toast 8 slices of your favorite gluten free multigrain bread and lightly butter. Lay one loaded chicken breast on a slice of toast, top with the sauteed onions and place the second piece of toast on top to create the sandwich. Repeat with remaining to make 4 sandwiches. Slice on diagonal and serve with the BBQ sauce on the side for dipping. We also serve Trader Joe's Ridge Cut Salt & Pepper Chips.

Key Lime Pie - Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Blend the cookies in food processor until evenly ground into crumbs. Combine cookie crumbs, melted butter and sugar with a fork until well blended and press into 9" pie plate that has been sprayed with non-stick spray. Bake for 8-10 minutes in 350 oven until golden brown. Remove and set aside to cool.



Blend condensed milk and lime juice until combined. Add the eggs and beat for 2-3 minutes. Pour into prepared crust and bake 350 for 15 minutes.

Cool and refrigerate at least 2 hours. Serve with fresh whipped cream.

Try this variation: I made the same recipe above for Easter with two changes - the crust and topping. For the crust, use Pamela's Simplebites chocolate chip mini cookies (omit the sugar in recipe) and follow as written. I topped the pie with whipped cream, strawberries, and blueberries. Oh Joy! It was quoted, "The Best Ever!"
