IMPROVEMENT— WE CHAT WITH MARK ABOUT THE STUFF YOU'VE ALWAYS WANTED TO KNOW!

CM: The Big -Ass Book of Crafts is fantastic! All that TV time, the books you have written, your clothing designs, the list goes on and on. We don't know how you do it all. As you can pretty easily guess, Ma dedicated lots of time and energy to getting and addressing some of the most complicated craft needs of our time. What she has seen in this process is this— people need to relax! What better way to relax than by taking a long bath, slathering on some aroma therapy lotion or silky lip balm. Like all of you, Ma loves the worldwide web. She found this great site, www.soapcrafters.com, with excellent ideas! Here is a sampling.

Creamy Lip Balm

1-1/2 Tablespoons Beeswax
3/4 Tablespoon Cocoa Butter
1-1/2 Tablespoons Almond Oil or other nice liquid oil
3 Tablespoons Shea Butter
2-1/2 Tablespoons Mango Butter
1/8 to 1/4 teaspoon Soap Crafters Flavor Oil
Melt Bee's Wax, Shea Butter, Mango Butter and cocoa butter on the stove. Make sure the temperature gets over 180 F. Remove from heat, add Almond Oil and flavoring. Stir. Fill lip balm tubes or pots. Should fill about 13 lip balm tubes.

Glorious Lotion

8 Tablespoons Shea Butter
3 Tablespoons Almond Oil
4 Tablespoons Olive Oil

ASK MA FIOSA

Mamma Fiosa, known more widely as Ma Fiosa, has served as consigliere to the North Park Craft Mafia in all our crafty needs. Lucky for you, now you don't have to be made to get counsel.

3 rounded Tablespoons Emulsifying Wax
3 Tablespoons Liquid Glycerin
3 cups (24 ounces) Aloe Vera
1 teaspoonful of SoapCrafters Sweetgrass Fragrance
3 drops of Emerald Green Liquid Colorant
4 eight ounce clear bottles
4 lotion pumps
A Thermometer
A Stick Blender

This is an awesome lotion that contain a high percentage of shea butter and a good amount of Aloe. It is light and your skin will drink it right up. It leaves your skin smooth and there is no waxy or oily feel to your body afterwards.

Heat Shea Butter to 200 degrees, then turn off the heat. Let it sit for 15 minutes. If it looks like it will drop below 180, then give it a shot of heat again. You want to be sure that it sustains the 180 degree temperature for those 15 minutes.

Remove from stove and add Emulsifying Wax. Stir until melted. Add the almond and olive oils to the mix.

In a separate pot, mix together the aloe vera and the glycerin. Stir until mixed. Heat to 120 degrees and remove from heat. Make sure oils mixture is 120 degrees, heat if necessary but don't get it too hot.

Slowly pour aloe mixture in to the oils mixture. Whip with a stick blender for about 1 minute. Allow to cool for about 30 minutes, but whip it again every 5-10 minutes.

After 30 minutes is up, add the fragrance and colorant. Stir in with a stick blender. Pour in to bottles. Be sure to leave room in the bottle for the lotion pump. They take up more room in the bottle than you think! You will probably have a couple ounces of lotion left over.

MA MANGIA

GOT CHEESE? C'MON, YOU KNOW YOU LIKE IT!

Fall may bring a slight chill in the air, but it is still the perfect time for a picnic. This recipe will produce an excellent base ingredient for a picnic. Just get bread, tomatoes and basil and you are in business! As always, when she seeks good food, Ma Mangia has gone straight to the Famiglia De Palo for the most delicious of authentic Italian recipes. Like all De Palo recipes, this one has been passed down from generation to generation of De Palos, making stops along the way on tables from southern Italy to Brooklyn to North Park. *Mangia!*

You Will Need

- 1 Gallon of Whole Milk**
- 4 Rennet Tablets (available in vegetarian or traditional)**

What to Do

Crush rennet tablets in a little bit of water. Heat milk to 110 degrees. Add crushed rennet tablets and mix well. Let rest for 15 minutes. Stir curd into small pieces. Let stand another 15 minutes. Strain in a colander lined with cheesecloth until cheese and whey are separated. This is called *Fresh Cheese*. It can be eaten this way.



When the cheese is allowed to ferment, it will become slightly sour to taste. It can be sliced and hot water added to soften curd, then stretched and shaped into mozzarella balls or logs. Fresh cheese can be salted, dried and aged for 6 months and it will become grating cheese. If mozzarella is salted, dried and aged it becomes another type of cheese, provolone. You may also choose to store the cheese in some of the salted water used to make the cheese.

SERVING SUGGESTION: Slice and serve with crusty bread, a basil leaf and tomato slice. Put those ingredients on a panini press or griddle for a new twist on the grilled cheese sandwich. Or slice, squeeze a little honey on it and sprinkle with almonds for a yummy dessert.
