Meet the Design Team From Alexander Henry Fabrics! Brother and Sister Duo - Nicole & Philip DeLeon!

We were fortunate enough to get an interview with the awesome design team behind our favorite collections from Alexander Henry Fabrics - Nicole and Philip DeLeon! If you're not yet a fan of AH fabrics, you will be. We love to use them in our craft and fashion projects!

Phillip and Nicole, I would like to thank you for doing this interview with the San Diego North Park Craft Mafia!

Nicole: Thank you! We are happy to participate. How can you say no to the Craft Mafia?:)

What is your favorite drink?

Nicole: The first cup of a.m. tea: Assam superb, a spot of milk & sugar.

Phillip: Right now, watermelon juice mixed with lemonade. And I never say no to a cold Stella

Artois.

What music do you like?

Phillip: Vocal jazz is a major love and influence. I also try in vain to keep up with some of the new bands coming out of everywhere...

Nicole: Past: Frank Sinatra & Steely Dan. Present: Little Joy. Always: the Beatles.

Where do you find inspiration for your various collections?

Nicole: Inspiration comes from all places. We keep our eyes open. Design is a 24 hour job of looking. (o.k. minus of few hours for sleeping). Museum shows, couture fashion, music, old movies, travel, literature. We love artistic movements from the past as inspiration for quilt groups, whether that be Andy Warhol's Factory, or Isadora Duncan and the Bloomsbury movement. They are fun to explore.

Alexander Henry has many Dia de los Muertos and Native American inspired designs. How did those collections come about?

Nicole: We started designing our Santa Fe group in the early 1990's. Western and Native American culture was very popular, and we were enjoying trips to Santa Fe and Taos while they still resembled the old way. Dia de los Muertos was a natural progression, and we feel very close to both of these themes as we have strong roots in the Southwest.

Which design or collection is your favorite?

Phillip: Tough question. Next question. **Nicole:** Our collections are kind of like children:

hard to pick a favorite. I fell in love while painting one collection, so maybe I would say that one.

What makes you decide to start a new collection?

Phillip: Money. (Laughter) No, kidding. My sister usually makes me start the next one.

Or...how does a new collection come about?

Phillip: We sit down and pull things out -- visuals, scraps, scribbles, photos that we've been hoarding. Then we just start talking and laying things out. We ask ourselves why we love what we're looking at. What's great about it? We love this process. All sorts of things surface. Sometimes what we decide to embark on has nothing to do with what's on the floor. But what's layed out

there GOT US THERE.

Do you get requests from consumers about what they would like to see?

Phillip: All the time. And thank goodness. Input from our customers is so important. We're not mind readers and what we personally love or want isn't always what sells the most.

Do you create your original designs using paints, pencils, or computer? What is your medium of choice?

Nicole: We use water based media (watercolor, dyes and gouache), but the designs are usually started in pencil. There are no computers in our studio!

How long does it take to get the fabric to production from the time the original design is created?

Nicole: It takes anywhere from 3 to 6 months.

What's the most interesting project you have seen your fabrics used in?

Phillip: Fabric sushi the size of a Scottie terrier.

Nicole: Someone made a gigantic stuffed deer out of our heavy weight. Neato.

What new types of fabric can we look forward to seeing?

Phillip: Well we love the new heavy-weight cotton oxford collection (Fashion for Home) we've introduced in the last couple of seasons. It's a new fabric quality that we love. The prints are fierce. But in terms of new prints? We're working on what we call a globally-inspired collection called **ZANZABELLE** that is rocking our world right now. Brilliant saturated color, large scale, floral with hints of the east, you just wanna get your hands on it.

Nicole: Our line is like the contents of a refrigerator: there will always be milk and eggs (Nicole's Prints & Santa Fe), and then sometimes we have cherries and avocado and imported cheese andyou know what we mean. So that would be (this coming season) a great new group called **Good Earth, Lorenza** and......I LOVE our new **In the Kitchen** group.

CRAFTY BOOK REVIEW: ALTERNATION BY ALEXANDRA UNDERHILL & SHANNON OKEY

Do you need an awesome new look for Back-to-School? Or maybe it is just time to spice up your wardrobe? Do you despair because the economy has your wallet feeling down? Well the authors of AlterNation are here to help. This book shows you lots of ways to re-vamp your wardrobe without having to go buy all new clothes! So what's the trick? They show you how to alter what you already have, or stuff that you can buy cheaply at thrift stores and sales! There are projects that range from beginning sewer to advanced. I would recommend having a sewing machine to get the most out of this book, there are some projects you could hand-sew or even glue, but really you will be missing out (unless you go crazy nuts with the hand-sewing which I just don't have patience for!). Some of the projects you can just embellish existing clothing without changing around the basic shape or fit, while other projects get crazy with the scissors and do a total reconstruction! In one of my favorite projects they take a button-up shirt and turn it into a really neat interpretation of a corset! They also take 4 pairs of old jeans and turn them into a really neat flared skirt! The other great thing about this book is the stunning photography! They also have photos for many of the step-by-step instructions which is always helpful. THESE SNACK RECIPES WON'T MAKE YOU LATE FOR CLASS!

It's that time of year again. Time to get back to school! If you have a full day scheduled, you might want to take some snacks to enjoy in between classes. We've found some recipes that are fast to make and taste great too!

Great Granola Mix:

- 1 cup honey
- 1 cup apple juice
- 10 cups oatmeal (uncooked)
- 1 cup whole wheat flakes & flaxseed cereal
- 1/2 cup sunflower seeds (unsalted)
- 1/2 cup almonds, sliced
- 1/2 cup sesame seeds
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 4 Tsp. cinnamon

Energy Balls:

- 1 cup raisins (can substitute with cranberries)
- 1/2 cup oatmeal
- 1/2 cup peanut butter
- 1 Tbs. flax seed (optional)
- 1 Tbs. wheat germ (optional)
- 1Tbs. honey
- 1/2 cup finely chopped peanuts, mini-chocolate chips, or shredded coconut for coating

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Mix dry ingredients, then add liquid and mix well. Spread on cookie sheets and toast for 25-50 minutes at 375°F, stirring often.
- 2. Add dry fruit.
- 3. Store in an airtight container. Enjoy.

Variation: Add dried cranberries and dried bananas - delicious!

DIRECTIONS:

Mix all ingredients in a bowl and make into small round balls. Roll in wheat germ. Let set in refrigerator 30 minutes.

Variation: For a peanut-free version, substitute sunflower-seed or soy-nut butter for the peanut butter.
